## VILLAGE OF VOLO CELEBRATES ITS 25TH ANNIVERSARY

In April, the Village of Volo celebrated its 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. On April 20, 1993, the residents of Volo voted to incorporate. They wanted to preserve the identity of their community rather than be annexed by neighboring communities.

Volo's history dates back to the mid-1800s when Forksville was surveyed and platted at McHenry-Chicago Road (Gilmer Road) and Waukegan Road (Volo Village Road). Forksville was renamed Volo in 1868.

The Village began to grow and develop in the early 2000s when construction began on several subdivisions, including:

- Terra Springs (2002)
- Remington Pointe (2005)
- Lancaster Falls (2006)
- Symphony Meadows (2006)
- Autumn Grove (2007)

Over the last 15 years, 2,000 new homes were constructed, despite the downturn in the housing market. Volo's population has grown from 200 to 5,400, with many young families moving into the community.

During the same period, the Village permitted over 750,000 square feet of non-residential construction, bringing national brands such as Home Depot, Aldi, Starbucks, Jimmy John's, Thorntons, and Dunkin' Donuts to the Village.

Development continues in the Village with Remington Pointe North, a 286-unit subdivision located on Route 12 between Remington Pointe and Terra Springs, and Speedway, which recently opened at Route 12 and Volo Village Road.

With over 1,500 acres of undeveloped land in and around the Village, and delivery of Lake Michigan water anticipated in 2019, Volo is well-positioned to continue its growth and development.

## Parking Regulations

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, parking is prohibited on all Village streets between 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM.

Parking of vehicles across the sidewalk or blocking driveways and mailboxes is also prohibited.

Vehicles found in violation of these ordinances may be ticketed. The minimum fine is \$50.

## Garbage & Recycling Carts

Pursuant to Village Ordinance (O-17-08), garbage/recycling carts may only be placed at the curb between 4:00 PM on Sunday and 10:00 PM on Monday.

If stored outside, carts may only be kept in side or rear yards and must be screened from view of the street.

Homeowner Associations (HOAs) may have additional requirements.

## Smoke Detectors

Daylight Savings Time ends Sunday, November 4<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 AM.

Fox Lake and Wauconda Fire encourage residents to change the batteries in their smoke detectors when they change their clocks.

It is estimated that while 90% of households have smoke detectors, one-third have dead or missing batteries.
