Overnight Parking Enforcement Begins

On November 1st, the Village began nightly enforcement of its overnight parking regulations.

Parking is prohibited on all Village streets between 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM. Vehicles found parked in violation of this regulation will be ticketed (\$25.00 fine).

No Overnight Parking signs are posted at the entrance(s) to each subdivision.

The Village is contracting for overnight parking enforcement with the Wauconda Police Department.

Individuals can request a waiver or purchase a permit to park a passenger vehicle on the street overnight.

Visit www.villageofvolo.com/parking for details and restrictions.

Parking is also prohibited on any street after the accumulation of 2 inches or more of snow, until snow removal operations are complete.

Vehicles found parked in violation of this regulation will be ticketed (\$200.00 fine) and subject to towing.

Snow Ordinance signs are posted at the entrance(s) to each subdivision.

Overnight parking permits and waivers are not valid after 2" or more of snow during snow removal operations.

Leaf Collection

During the month of November, Groot will offer FREE leaf collection.

Leaves must be placed in separate paper landscape waste bags. Stickers are not required for bags containing leaves only.

Village Ordinance prohibits burning leaves and other landscape waste.

Garage & Porch Lights

Residents are encouraged to turn on their garage and porch lights after dark. These lights supplement the street lights and enhance the safety of our neighborhoods.

Most garage and porch lights can be placed on a timer or photocell to automatically turn on after dark.

Non-working street lights should be reported to Village Hall at (847) 740-6982.

Winter Parking Regulations

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, parking is prohibited on all Village streets after a snowfall of two (2") or more inches, until snow removal operations are complete.

Vehicles found in violation of this ordinance are subject to ticketing and towing.

Residents with disabled vehicles should contact the Lake County Sheriff's Office at (847) 549-5200.

Sidewalks, Driveways & Fire Hydrants

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, property owners are required to clear sidewalks of snow and ice within 24 hours of a snowfall.

When clearing driveways, pile snow to the right of the driveway when facing the street to limit the snow thrown back by plows. Village Ordinance prohibits dumping snow in the street when clearing sidewalks and driveways.

Residents are asked to remove snow and ice around fire hydrants so they are clear and accessible to emergency fire crews.
