2020 Census Data Released

Volo's Population Increases to 6,122

In August, the U.S. Census Bureau released detailed data from the 2020 Census, including population information for states, counties, and municipalities.

On April 1, 2020, the Village's population was 6,122—an increase of 723 from its 2017 Special Census and 3,193 from the 2010 Census.

"Volo continues to be one of the fastest growing communities in Lake County," said Mayor Stephen Henley.

Since 2017, the Village has added 300+ residential units.

"Sustained growth is important," added Mayor Henley. "The Village's share of certain state tax revenues is based on population."

These shared revenues, which include income tax, use tax, and motor fuel tax, help to reduce the Village's dependence on property taxes.

Beginning in 2022, the Village will receive approximately \$125,000 in additional state-shared revenues annually. These revenues are used to fund debt service, operations, and capital improvements.

Additional data from the 2020 Census, including demographic and housing data, will be released later this year.

In partnership with the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO), the Village offers clothing and shoe recycling.

The clothing and shoe recycling containers are located in the northwest corner of the Village Hall parking lot.

Garbage & Recycling Carts

Pursuant to Village Ordinance (O-17-08), garbage/recycling carts may only be placed at the curb between 4:00 PM on Sunday and 10:00 PM on Monday.

If stored outside, carts may only be kept in side or rear yards and must be screened from view of the street.

Homeowners Associations (HOAs) may have additional requirements.

Smoke Detectors

Daylight Savings Time ends Sunday, November 7th at 2:00 AM.

Fox Lake and Wauconda Fire encourage residents to change the batteries in their smoke detectors when they change their clocks.

It is estimated that while 90% of households have smoke detectors, one-third have dead or missing batteries.

From the Mayor...

Over the last 15 years, I have watched Volo grow and develop into the community it is today. When I moved to Remington Pointe in 2007, less than half of the homes in the subdivision had been built. The first residents had just moved into Autumn Grove, Lancaster Falls, and Symphony Meadows. Only Terra Springs was built-out.

It has been amazing to watch the young families that have moved to Volo grow with the community. Volo truly is a *family community* and our residents make it a special place to live.

Our housing mix has allowed residents to stay in the community when moving from smaller homes to larger homes. With the addition of the age-targeted Andare models in Remington Pointe North, residents can stay in the community when downsizing too. The Woods of Terra Springs will provide an opportunity for individuals who are not looking to buy to move into the community.

These additional households help to keep our water and garbage and recycling rates low, as the cost of the operating our water system and managing our garbage and recycling contract are spread among more accounts.

Population growth is also a key factor in attracting non-residential development, which diversifies our property tax base and lessens the burden on homeowners.
